position we were in before it began. Both federal retirees and active federal employees have been the center of discussion during the federal debt limit negotiations. The current increase in the federal debt limit, that was accomplished on August 2, 2011, is just round one in a bottle that will resound during the upcoming year, leading up to the 2012 national elections. NARFE Headquarters stated it well in their GEMS message **“Debt Deal Spares Fed Pay, Benefits – for Now.”** The message was *“Thanks in part to the efforts of NARFE members, the debt limit compromise (Public Law 112-25) passed by Congress and signed into law by the President does not make any reductions in the retirement, pay or health benefits of federal employees and annuitants. Spending caps in the law, however, could affect active federal employee job security because agency budgets may be impacted. But the overall threat has **NOT** disappeared: Federal civilian retirement and health benefits continue to be vulnerable because the new law creates a bipartisan ‘Super Committee’ of Congress with a mandate to cut spending by an additional \$1.5 trillion before the end of this year.”*

The central point of all of this is the size and role of the federal government. One group wishes to increase taxes and spend more money to extend the reach and operation of the federal government; while the other sees the need for a more limited federal government, and is trying to reduce revenues to starve government operations. While the House of Representatives adopted a budget, the Senate has not. Authorization bills need to be completed by September 30th to keep the federal government in operation. Expect more brinkmanship management and continuing resolutions in fiscal year 2012. In November, expect to see a lot of last minute action reach the second hurdle in the debt limit bill.

PRESIDENT'S GREETING

The summer vacation period has ended, but federal employees and retirees seem to be in the same



Federal employees and retirees and their benefits will be under fire. NARFE is responding well with the Heartbeat of America program; however, the country cannot continue to run an annual deficit of \$1.3 trillion. Either a reduction in spending, and increase in revenues, or a combination of both must be made. When the economy recovers, we can expect additional federal revenues. However, Congress is currently reluctant to

increase taxes because many see that as further endangering possible economic recovery. Further borrowing, likewise, is not viewed as good for the future stability of the country.

Social Security is solvent for the next decade. The problem is that the Social Security trust fund, like the federal employees retirement trust fund, has been invested in U.S. Government bonds, which must be redeemed to pay for the benefits. We can expect to see further freezes of the salaries of federal employees, a change in the way cost of living adjustments (COLA's) are calculated, and increased costs for health benefits. The need for reduction in COLA's will be further emphasized by the size of the currently calculated COLA for federal employees and retirees, and for Social Security recipients.

You may be wondering, with all of this going on, can we as NARFE members do anything about it. One thing for sure, we cannot just sit back and accept what changes are imposed on us. We must continue to contact our Congressmen and Senators and let them know who we are and how we feel on these issues. We must also ensure that NARFE remains strong. On the local level, that means that Dulles Chapter 1241 continues to grow in numbers, remains a viable and dynamic organization, and has leadership positions filled with people who are capable of running and leading the Chapter.

Dulles Chapter is currently operating well, and, with the recent appointment of Dick Giangerelli as the Chapter Treasurer, all of the Chapter Executive Committee positions are filled. However, please note, a new year will be starting soon and we will need new faces on the Chapter Executive Committee. I encourage you to step up and contact the Chapter Nominating Committee. You can be one of those new faces that are needed.

An article in this Newsletter by Dave LeRoy indicates that, relative to most other Chapters in the NARFE Virginia Federation and NARFE as a whole, Dulles Chapter is experiencing a modest growth in membership numbers. We have the Chapter Membership Committee to thank for this; however, we still seem to lose almost as many members every month as we gain. It is unclear what the cause is, so we need your help. If you will identify ways of improving operation of the Chapter or the services provided by the Chapter, the Chapter Executive Committee will attempt to implement them.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

National Legislation

Congress is back in session and a 12-member special board of commissioners has been appointed to find significant further budget savings by Thanksgiving. The August extension of the debt limit incorporated an agreement to find approximately \$3.5 trillion in spending reductions over the next 10 years. About half of this amount was identified immediately in the debt limit extension legislation. The 12-member board is responsible for identifying where the remainder can be found. If this board cannot reach an agreement, both domestic and defense spending will be cut to make up the difference. The belief is that both major political parties would find the automatic cuts so objectionable that they will come to a compromise on more directed cuts and revenue enhancements. In addition to this turmoil, Congress must pass all of the Fiscal Year 2012 appropriation bills before September 30th or pass some type of continuing resolution to fund the operation of the federal government. As yet, the Senate has not



passed a budget resolution for Fiscal Year 2011. The operational authority of much of the Federal Aviation Authority was passed with a short-term fix in early August and will again be on the table in September, as will the reauthorization of federal gasoline taxes and highway expenditures. With Congress in session typically from Tuesday through Thursday, there is little time to address all of these issues. With only 14 months remaining before the 2012 federal election, the Administration and members of Congress are intent on presenting the appearance of serving their constituents and fixing the problems of the economy.

Federal employees are already impacted, as significant reductions in appropriations will be needed to meet the goals of the current debt reduction legislation. The budgetary savings that will be proposed by Thanksgiving, whatever they may be, will only intensify the impact on federal employees.

In addition, the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) has stated that, with its financial current commitments, it will be unable to continue to operate. Proposed changes include not filling vacancies, laying off over a thousand workers, closing many post offices, and foregoing payment into the federal retirement fund. The USPS is also considering pulling out of the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program (FEHBP) and setting up a separate USPS health insurance program for USPSA employees.

So far, federal retirees and annuitants have not been affected by the cost cutting measures in place or under consideration; however, it appears that recent inflationary forces and current legislation could result in a significant cost of living adjustment (COLA) in January. Expect to see a strong effort to change the process for calculating COLA's to reduce federal expenditures. Also expect to see an effort to increase the percentage of health care insurance and costs that federal employees and retirees, and Medicare recipients pay.

Keep your Congressman and Senators on speed dial. You will probably be called upon to contact them to stress the need to protect our earned benefits.

State Legislation

With the August 23rd State primaries out of the way, the candidates for the local Delegate and Senate seats in the General Assembly are now decided. If the State Legislative boundaries shifted such that you were placed into a different State Legislative District, by now you should have received a new voter ID card.



The boundaries for the Federal Legislative Districts in the Commonwealth of Virginia have still to be finalized

and approved. It appears that the boundaries will not be finalized before the November State election.

The State election this fall will be for all of the seats in the General Assembly and for local constitutional offices. You can expect to see a lot of signs along the roads and in front of some houses. And, since the Northern Virginia region has increased in population faster than other portions of the State, there will be new, local State Legislative Districts. Many of the districts will have different boundaries, and the 13th State Senate district and the 87th Delegate district have been relocated to Northern Virginia. Many Dulles Chapter members that had been represented by either Tag Greason or Tom Rust will now be in relocated 87th Delegate District. State Senate District 13 has been relocated west of the 33rd Senate District.

Are You Prepared?

Each of you can remember where you were on Tuesday, August 23rd at 1:51 pm when the earth shook, but were you prepared for it? Did you run outside? Did you hid in a doorway? Did you hid under a desk or some other furniture? Did you scrunch down next to some bulky furniture? Did you even know what to do? If not, I encourage you to visit www.vaemergency.gov and review the emergency plans that every one should consider implementing.

In late August, Hurricane Irene passed though Virginia, inundating the areas from North Carolina through New Hampshire and Vermont. In early September, Tropical Storm Lee passed through Virginia, inundating areas from Louisiana through Maine. Were you prepared? If not, check out Virginia's "2011 Hurricane Guide" on www.vaemergency.gov.

Should you lose electricity, remember to have a battery powered or crank-up radio, flashlight, and cell phone available and ready. You should also plan on being self-sustaining for three days; however, I don't advise that you rush to the grocery store and buy everything in sight, whether you need it or not.

Both Dominion Virginia Power and Northern Virginia Electric Coop (NOVEC) are prepared to respond to any outages that may occur, but they need to be told about the outages. The following are some telephone numbers to call to report electricity outages:

- Dominion Virginia Power – 866-366-4357 (866-DOM-HELP)
- NOVEC – 703-335-0500 or 888-335-0500

Other Utility Companies are also ready to help. Have their telephone numbers readily available.

But being prepared is more that knowing who to call. It also includes knowing what to do both before and after a natural disaster strikes. Find out who in your local area have some expertise for these events and talk with them

or attend one of their briefings. In Northern Virginia, these organizations include the Virginia Department of Emergency Management, Fairfax and Loudoun Counties office of Emergency Management, and the Herndon Police Department.

Being prepared also includes knowing what to take with you if you need to evacuate and what to leave behind. That would include tax records, wills, marriage licenses, birth certificates, check books, cash, jewelry, pets, etc. What you plan on taking with you should be in one location and easy to grab quickly as you rush out the door.

Also know who is available to help repair or help pay for the damage afterward. Of course, Insurance Companies that carry your home owner's or renter's insurance policy are one source. Another source for federal employees and retirees is the Federal Employee Education and Assistance Fund (FEEA), which will have a speaker at the Dulles Chapter 1241 September Luncheon meeting. Another source may be local businesses. In fact, two examples of companies offering some form of financial assistance following Hurricane Irene are Home Depot and JP Morgan Chase Bank. Home Depot offered 12-month interest free loans for the purchase of \$299 or more from Home Depot of items needed for the repair of hurricane damage. JP Morgan Chase Bank offered free ATM access, no matter whose ATM machine was used.

In addition, low interest disaster relief loans are available to all federal employees and retirees. Contact the fund at 800-338-0755, feeahq@aol.com, or write to NARFE-FEEA Disaster Fund, c/o FEEA, 3333S. Wadsworth Blvd, Suite 300, Lakewood, CO 80227. A disaster relief application can also be downloaded at www.feea.org/Disaster.

FEEA is a private, nonprofit 501(c)(3) agency, primarily funded through contributions to the FEEA CFC Pledge #11185 but also receives funding from NARFE and individual NARFE members, and companies such as GIECO and Blue Cross/Blue Shield. Since 1986, the FEEA Emergency Assistance Program has provides more than \$8 million in financial assistance to federal families experiencing natural disasters such as floods, fires, and hurricanes, and to those experiencing unforeseen personal emergencies

such as illness or death in the family. With emergency assistance need already topping \$250,000 since May 1st, donations to FEEA 's Natural Disaster Fund are urgently needed. This is a way of making a contribution to an internal charity, one that stands ready to only helps federal employees and retirees.

3. Sign in with your last name and NARFE ID number (your NARFE ID number is printed on the label on your NARFE monthly magazine;
4. On the left side of the opening page, click on “Membership”;
5. Click on “Update Records” on the pop-up table;
6. Enter the following information, when requested:
 - NARFE ID number;
 - Your birth date;
7. Update the information listed;
8. Back out of the system and log off;
9. Go back in, following the above steps, and make sure everything was accepted and is correct.
